

FTP Synchronize

General

FTP Synchronize is an easy to use simple application to synchronize local folder with folder located on the FTP server for some specific user account.

Installation

Download latest FTP Synchronize from it's homepage:

After downloading, the installer executable, install FTP Synchronize to your computer and launch it to apply settings for automatic folder synchronizing as follows:



- 1) Click on “Settings” button on the main window

Host:	<input type="text" value="192.88.130.100"/>
User:	<input type="text" value="root@synchaccount"/>
Pass:	<input type="password" value="*****"/>
Target:	<input type="text" value="C:\Software\FTP"/> <input type="button" value="Browse"/>

- 2) Set FTP server name to Host field
- 3) Enter account information to User and Pass field that is setup onto the FTP server. FTP server account should have the folder that is going to be synchronized set as root for this account.
- 4) Click “Browse” to select local folder to keep synchronized with the FTP folder defined for the user account.
- 5) Apply settings by clicking on “Apply” button at the bottom of setting window.

Optional Settings

Allow deleting files from target folder

If enabled, files that does not exist on the server are deleted from the local folder too. Otherwise no files will be removed from the local folder even they don't exist on the server anymore.

Check for updated files daily

If enabled, FTP synchronize will automatically check for changed and new files from the server on day change. In case computer is not powered on while the day changes, check is done when it's powered on immediately. If not checked, the checking is only done by clicking on the "Synchronize Now" button on the main view.

Restore from tray in case files were updated

If enabled and FTP Synchronize is running minimized while it's checking the updates, it is restored and brought to topmost and show changed or updated files as a list in case there is any changes done to the folder synchronized.

Start on Windows startup minimized

If checked, FTP Synchronize will start on Windows startup automatically minimized to the tray icon. If unchecked, FTP Synchronize must be started manually.
